SUNDAY, October 16th, 2016
29th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.

Bishop's Annual Appeal - Serving Christ Among Us

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me" (Matthew 25:40).

This is **Commitment Weekend** for the **Bishop's Annual Appeal**. We will hear from Bishop Arthur J. Serratelli during the Mass with his audio homily. Following the Bishop's talk, we will conduct the In-Pew Drive for the Appeal. This provides an opportunity for people to make a pledge to the Appeal. Pledges can be paid all at once or in a series of payments.

To review, the Bishop's Annual Appeal assists with the day-to-day operating expenses of many causes in the Diocese of Paterson. The largest percentage of funds support our **Diocesan Catholic Charities** with donations to programs and services including: day care and extended day care for working poor families, assisted transportation for the elderly and medically frail, individual and family counseling, emergency food banks, group homes for adults with disabilities, substance abuse counseling, etc.

With the help of the Bishop's Annual Appeal last year, much was done to **support Catholic schools in the inner-city area**, including capital improvements such as roof replacement, HVAC upgrades, interior lighting and exterior doors. The Appeal also helped fund financial aid to assist families to afford Catholic school education.

The Annual Appeal also **helps fund the education of our seminarians and Nazareth Village**, our diocesan priests' retirement residence in Chester. This is especially important since the number of seminarians has increased dramatically in recent years, along with the cost of their formation. The Appeal helps both of these groups of men: those who are preparing for a lifetime of service to the Church and those who have faithfully served for decades.

The Annual Appeal also **serves as a parish fundraiser**, since half the amount received by the Diocese over our parish goal is returned to our parish for our own needs. The funds raised through the Annual Appeal are only used for certain purposes. The funds are never forwarded to any other local diocese or archdiocese. The funds raised in the Paterson Diocese stay in the Paterson Diocese.

Please be generous with your pledge and I say "Thank You" to those who already made a pledge.

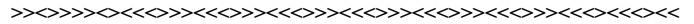

Craft Fair Elves Need Your Help

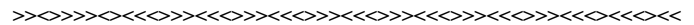

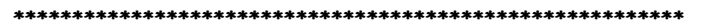

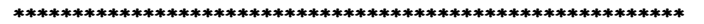
