**THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD – CHRISTMAS**

**First Reading: Isaiah 52:7-10**

Isaiah rejoices that God is bringing his exiled people home to Jerusalem. He calls out to the people to be glad because God will restore Jerusalem.

**Second Reading: Hebrews 1:1-6**

Paul explains to the Hebrews that although God had spoken through the prophets, people could not always completely understand the message. Now God has spoken to us by sending Jesus, the son, a reflection of God's glory and forgiver of our sins.

**Gospel: John 1:1-18**

John describes how the Word came into the world in the form of Jesus. All those who accept Jesus become children of God by sharing in Jesus' love. No one has seen God, but through Jesus, God was revealed to us.

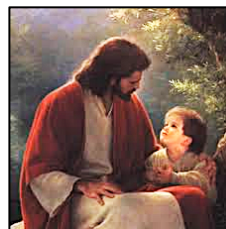

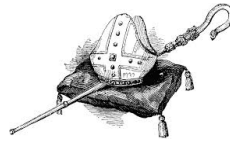

## The Nativity of the Lord

I wish all members of our parish a blessed Christmas. You will be remembered at all the Masses celebrated on this Solemnity of Christmas. I also **thank you for your generosity and goodness during my first six months here at St. Ann.** You answered the call to help with our many parish fundraisers and more. I appreciate your support of our parish.

I know the Christmas and New Year's holidays are busy times for many people; returning and exchanging gifts, preparing food for holiday dinners, increased house cleaning for guests, etc. I ask you to take a few minutes out of your day each day to spend time giving thanks to God for the many gifts he gives us. On that first Christmas, Mary and Joseph were not concerned about having enough Christmas gifts under the Christmas tree. Rather, they were concerned about bringing the Son of God into this world. Yes, it's all well and good to put cookies and milk out for Santa Claus on Christmas Eve (and carrots for the reindeer), but please do not forget the "reason for the season," and celebrate the Nativity of the Lord.

### An Overview of Christmas Time

Advent leads us to the joy of Christmas Time. **For Catholics, Christmas is more than just one day; it is an entire period of liturgical time.** The duration of Christmas Time demonstrates how sacred the memorial of Christ's birth and the early manifestations of the Savior of the World are to believers. Next to the yearly celebration of the Paschal Mystery during the Sacred Paschal Triduum and Easter Time, these are the days the Church holds most sacred.

**Christmas Time runs from Evening Prayer 1 of Christmas through the Sunday after Epiphany, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.** However, in 2017, since the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated on Sunday, January 8th, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is transferred to the following Monday, January 9th. During these days, we celebrate all that we prepared for during Advent. The lights in the church are bright to reflect the brightness of the Lord's glory shining throughout the world. Through his birth, life, Death, and Resurrection, he once and for all overcame the darkness.

Christmas Time concludes with the celebration of another manifestation feast: the Baptism of the Lord. During the event of Jesus' baptism, proclaimed this year from Matthew's account of the Gospel, the Spirit of God descends on Jesus, and a voice from heaven identifies him as "my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). Jesus' identity as the Son of God and Messiah is made known in this event. Moreover, just as Jesus' baptism marks the beginning of his public ministry, our Baptism marks the beginning of our life in the world as his disciples.

**ORIGIN OF "THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS"** – An Underground Catechism by Fr. Hal Stockert, Fishnet

You're all familiar with the Christmas song, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" I think. To most it's a delightful nonsense rhyme set to music. But **it had a quite serious purpose when it was written.** It is a good deal more than just a repetitious melody with pretty phrases and a list of strange gifts. **Catholics in England during the period 1558 to 1829, when Parliament finally emancipated Catholics in England, were prohibited from ANY practice of their faith by law - private OR public. It was a crime to BE a Catholic.**

"The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written in England as **one of the "catechism songs" to help young Catholics learn the tenets of their faith** - a memory aid, when to be caught with anything in \*writing\* indicating adherence to the Catholic faith could not only get you imprisoned, it could get you hanged...

**The song's gifts are hidden meanings to the teachings of the faith.** The "true love" mentioned in the song doesn't refer to an earthly suitor; it refers to God Himself. The "me" who receives the presents refers to every baptized person. The partridge in a pear tree is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. **In the song, Christ is symbolically presented as a mother partridge which feigns injury to decoy predators from her helpless nestlings, much in memory of the expression of Christ's sadness over the fate of Jerusalem: "Jerusalem! Jerusalem! How often would I have sheltered thee under my wings, as a hen does her chicks, but thou wouldst not have it so..."** The other symbols mean the following:

- 2 Turtle Doves = The Old and New Testaments
- 3 French Hens = Faith, Hope and Charity, the Theological Virtues
- 4 Calling Birds = the Four Gospels and/or Evangelists
- 5 Golden Rings = The first Five Books of the Old Testament, the "Pentateuch", which gives the history of man's fall from grace.
- 6 Geese a-laying = the Six days of Creation

- 7 Swans a-swimming = the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit / the Seven Sacraments
- 8 Maids a-milking = the Eight Beatitudes
- 9 Ladies Dancing = the Nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit
- 10 Lords a-leaping = the Ten Commandments
- 11 Pipers Piping = the Eleven Faithful Apostles
- 12 Drummers Drumming = the Twelve Points of Doctrine in the Apostle's Creed
